ICS rehab engineer Bob Paradiso creates custom assistive technology for ICS members when needed. However, in many cases inexpensive, easy-

to-install, off-the-shelf items can allow older adults or those with disabilities to live more independently in their homes. With the push of a button or

a simple voice command, even someone with extremely limited mobility can control common household appliances.

Being able to function in your own home is obviously a key to independent living. Bob has created gadgets that can help someone with a dis-

ability open their refrigerator door, roll window shades up and down, or use a telephone for the first time in years. He's developed systems to allow someone with very limited mobility to use eye movements to control a motorized wheelchair, a motorized grabber that can pick up and move small objects, or control household objects like lamps and fans.

These kinds of solutions can dramatically increase a person's independence.
